

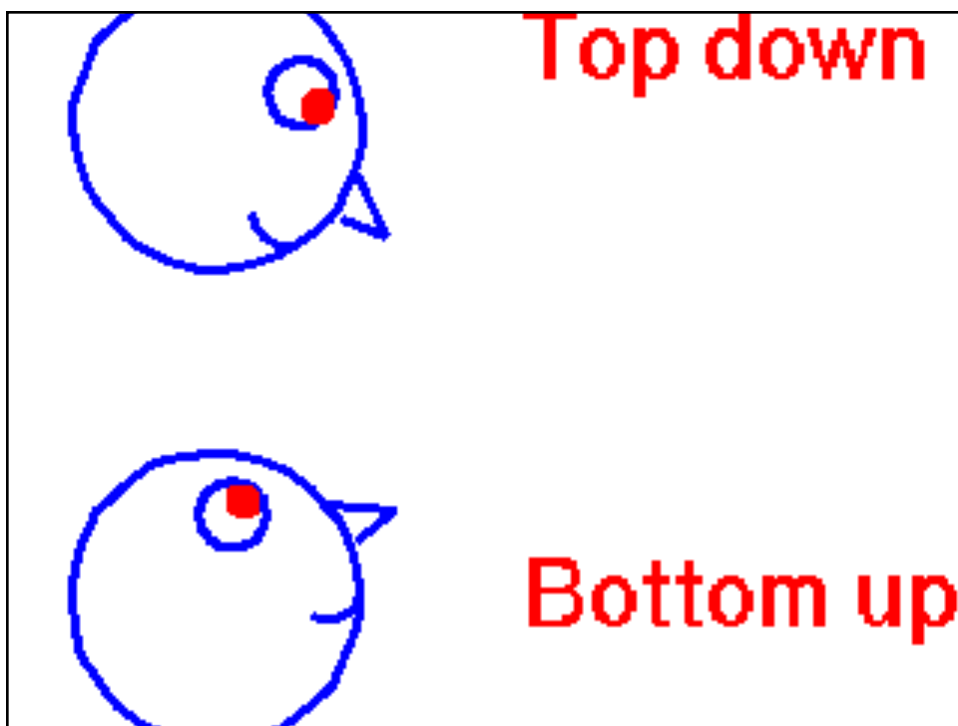

Historical perspective

- *1997: Development of the National Occupational Competency Profile (NOCP) – Federal Government funded*
- *2001: Approval by the Board of the Paramedic Association of Canada, acceptance by the Canadian Medical Association for the purpose of accreditation of educational programs*
- *2011: Revised NOCP, inclusion of Health Promotion and Public Safety (recognition of non-urgent care and contribution)*
- *2015: New Canadian Paramedic Profile*



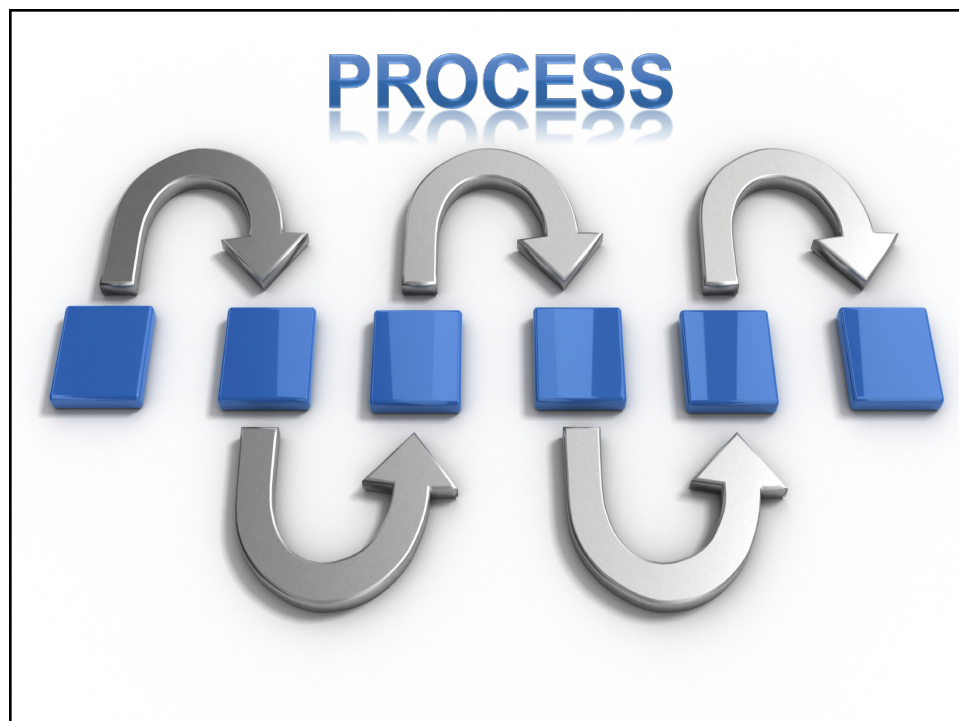
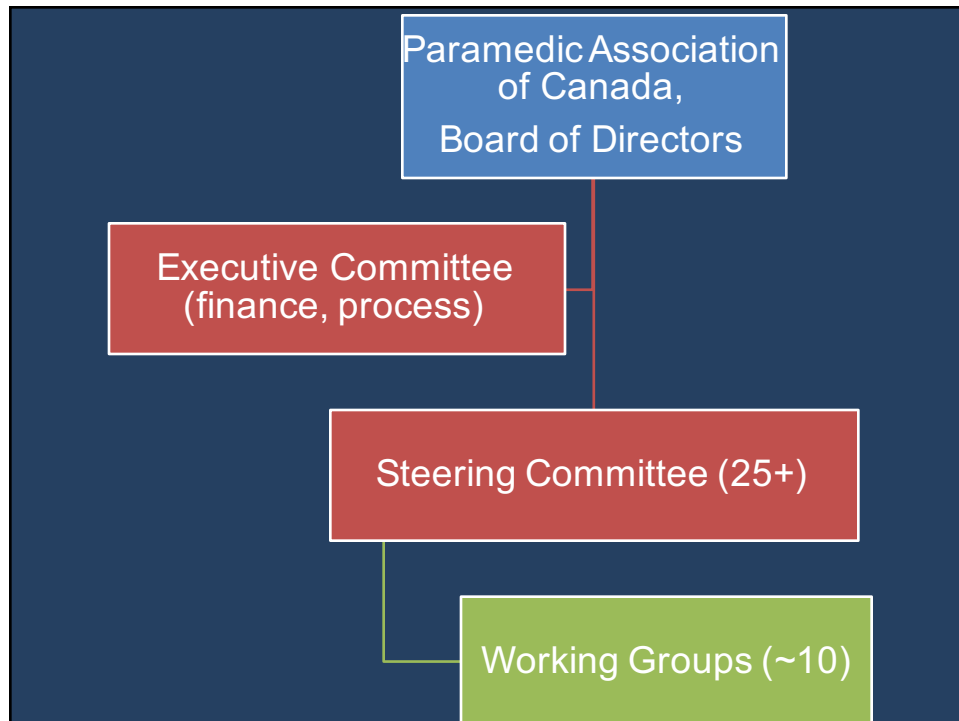
Entry to Practice

- *The NOCP was the reference document for curriculum development.*
 - *Strengths: Level of detail (sub-competencies, performance environments)*
 - *Weaknesses: Ineffective for regulation, standards of practice, code of ethics; essentially a skills document*





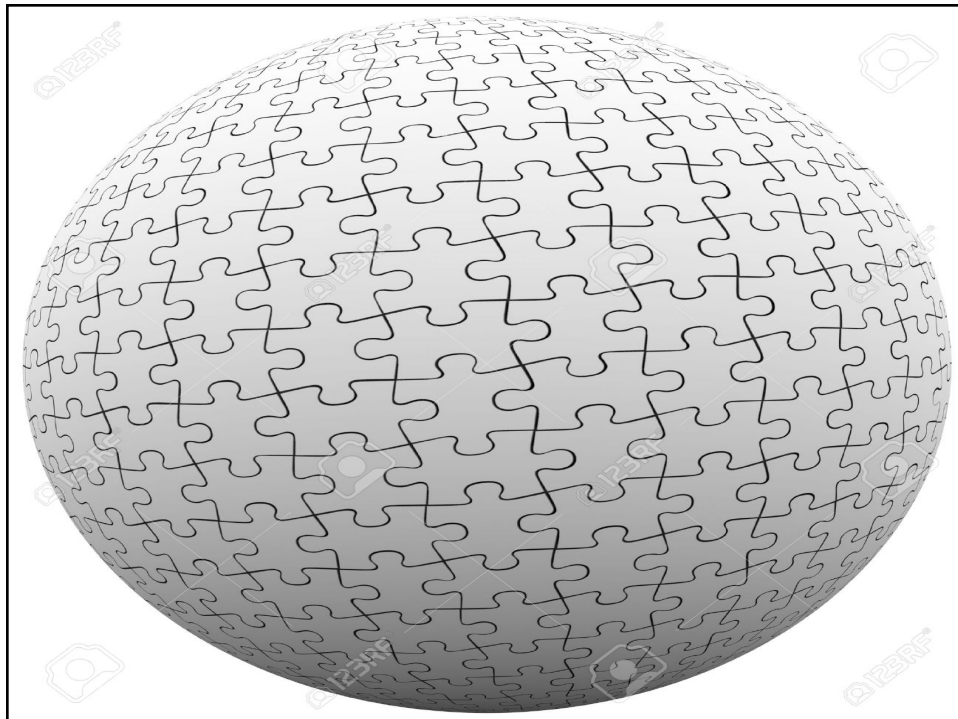


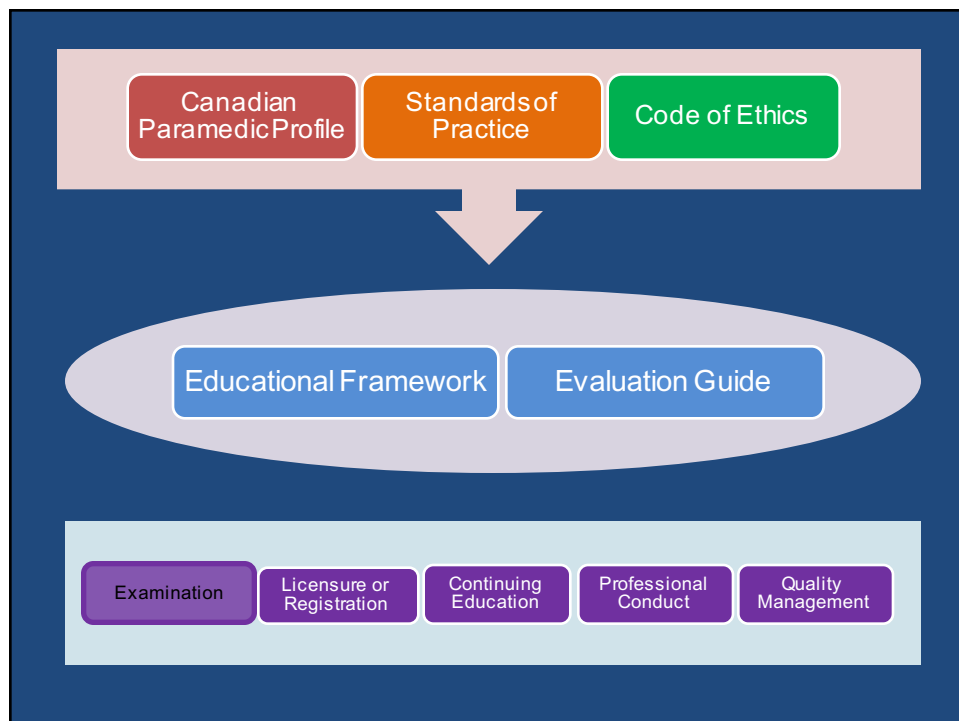
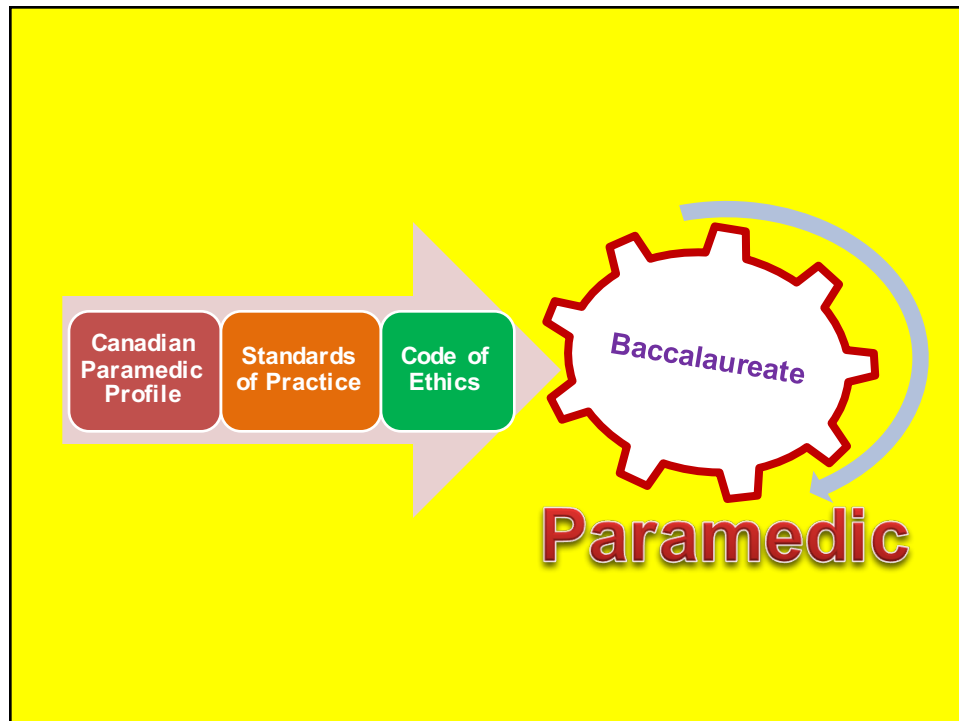


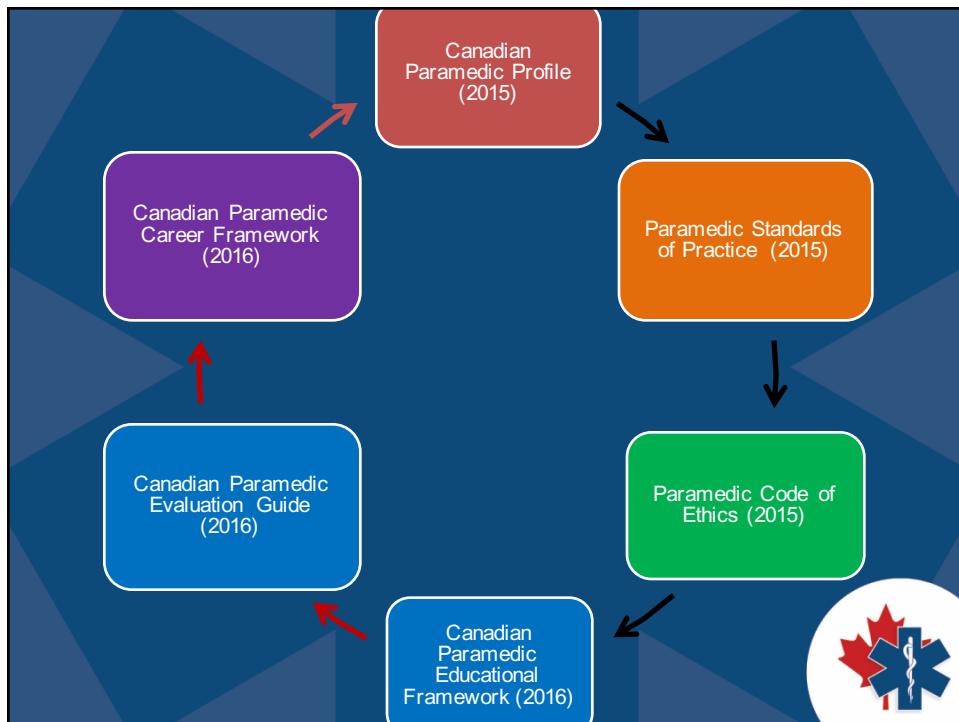
