Bylaw Resolution 1-2018

<u>Whereas:</u> Current Bylaw language suggests that registered members of PAC may use the term "registered" in conjunction with their professional designation initials

<u>And Whereas:</u> The ambiguity in the language creates confusion regarding a registered member of PAC and the regulated status of that member in their practice jurisdiction.

<u>And Whereas:</u> There is significant risk in such language because registered and regulated are so often confused and because many provinces use registered and regulated interchangeably.

<u>And Whereas:</u> Permitting a PAC member to use Registered and their initials of practice designation may create unnecessary confusion for regulators, members, governments and employers.

<u>Therefore Be it Resolved:</u> To amend Bylaw 3.2 "Registered Members" to remove language permitting members of the Paramedic Association of Canada to use the term "registered" in conjunction with their professional designation initials.

Policy Resolution 1-2018

<u>Whereas:</u> There is increased public awareness of the effects and prevalence of CIS/PTSD and consequent suicide rates amongst first responders,

<u>And Whereas:</u> There is an appetite amongst the membership to recognize CIS/PTSD related suicides as Line of Duty Deaths,

<u>And Whereas:</u> Government recognition and support mechanisms around first responder mental health issues are improving across the country,

<u>And Whereas:</u> The new Federal Memorial Grant program recognizes work stress related suicide as a duty related event amongst First Responders,

<u>And Whereas:</u> There are significant financial and sensitivity issues around recognizing suicide as a Line of Duty event for PAC and our other stakeholders.

<u>Therefore Be it Resolved:</u> To strike a working group with our stakeholders to establish policy regarding future and/or retrospective recognition of paramedic suicide as a Line of Duty event.
